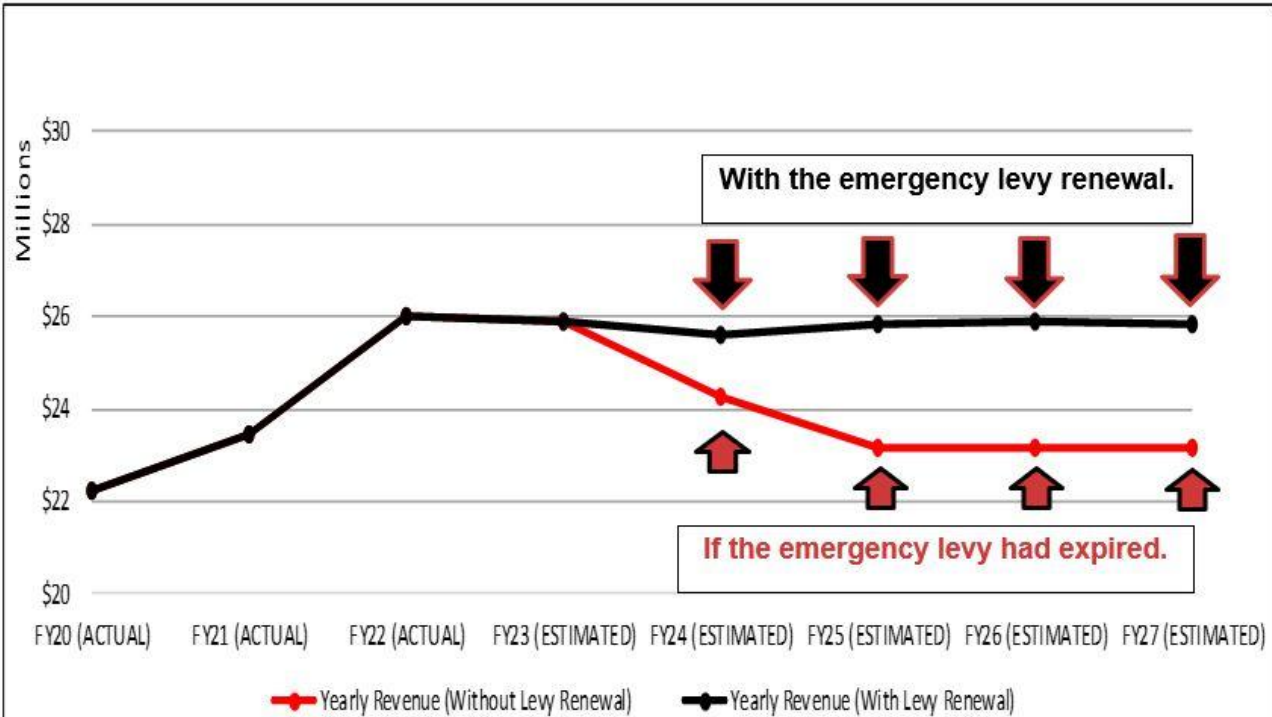

TIMELINE

1

District Data Review **Dec/ Jan, 2023**

Identify quantitative and qualitative data that can be used to create an accurate picture of the District's current progress.

2

Review Data with Stakeholder Groups **February, 2023**

Review District data with stakeholder groups and identify key success factors and primary barriers.

3

Determine Strategic Direction: Mission & Vision Statements **March 2023**

Review the current strategic plan against current data analysis and stakeholder feedback to determine a strategic direction and keep, abandon, or modify the mission and vision statements.

4

Develop Goals and Objectives **April, 2023**

Based upon the adopted mission and vision statements, work collaboratively with internal stakeholders to create focused goals and objectives with strategies, indicators, and desired outcomes for each goal.

5

Define Metrics, Set Timelines, and Track Progress **May, 2023**

Add details to the goals and objectives identify available resources and create defined and attainable action steps with timelines for completion.

6

Write and Publish a Five Year Strategic Plan **June, 2023**

Use the information and analysis collected to write a comprehensive five-year strategic plan that captures the voice of stakeholders, sets a clear direction for future action, and includes an annual review of progress.

Security Camera Updates



- Every building is receiving camera system upgrades
- Additional camera coverage to eliminate blind spots
- Higher resolution picture
- Artificial Intelligence Capabilities



Exterior Door Replacement & Improved Control

- Replacement of high-traffic doors at FHS/MMS that were nearly 20 years old and had mechanical issues
- Increased door access controls using AI & magnetic sensors
- Propped door sensor alarms/strobes and electronic notifications when a door is left open or accessed during unoccupied timeframes



3M Window and Glass Laminate

- Adding 3M glass laminate to the entrances of the Board of Education and Gilles-Sweet
- This will make breaching these areas much more difficult

Child Stabilization Grant/Daycare Block Grant

- EEC received three grants totaling of over \$400,000 which was used to provide stipends and salary increases for daycare employees. It was also used to support curriculum purchases, supplies, upgrades to the Parkview sound system, and the resurfacing of the Parkview gym floor.

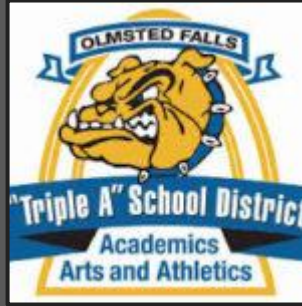

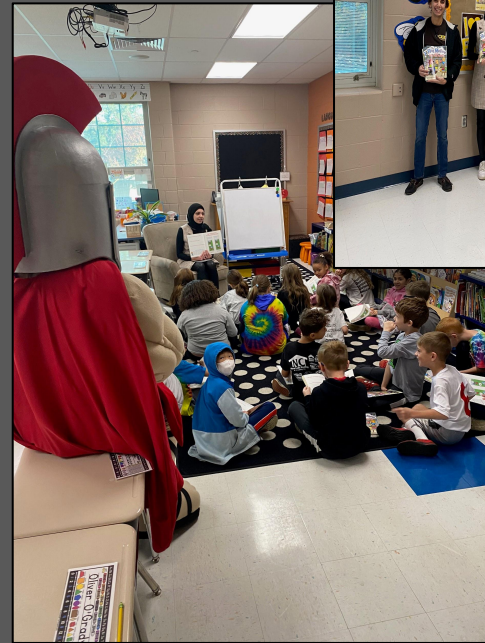

BW- High Frequency Tutoring Grant

- Baldwin Wallace University received \$203,400 from the Ohio Department of Education to partner with Fairview Park City Schools to have BW pre-service teacher candidates provide math and literacy tutoring to identified students
- Identified students receive “tutoring take home kits” to encourage families to engage in literacy and math games over breaks from school
- Identified students will be able to attend a Language, Literacy, and Learning Summer Camp at Baldwin Wallace University free of charge

School Calendar Change- Feb 28

- Board Approved February 28 as a non-student/professional development day
- Feb 28 is the date of the state mandated ACT exam for grade 11
- EEC Gilles-Sweet has traditionally done a ½ day of invitation only conferences
- This change would make one non-student day rather than having two different days which is inconvenient to parents with students at multiple schools
- In November, the Ohio Department of Education released 18 hours of training that is required for teachers as part of the Dyslexia law
